Councils

- Nicaea accepted the creed as offered by Deacon Athanasius: from "We believe in one God,... till His Kingdom shall have no end"
- Pope Alexandros was the Pope then. The Bishop of Rome was not called Pope yet

The council of Constantinople

- There was another heresy, that the Holy Spirit was not equal to the Father and the Son
- The Council in 381, taught that all three are equal and added the last part of the Creed "We believe in the Holy Spirit... Till: we look for the resurrection of the dead and the life of the age to come "

The Council of Ephesus 431

- Nestorius taught that Jesus had 2 natures, and refused to accept the term "Theotokos
- St Cyril, the Pillar of Faith, led the council
- St Shenouda the archimandrite, was with him
- Taught that: St Mary was the mother of Jesus, therefore she is the mother of the Son of God = The Theotokos
- Nestorius, the Archbishop of Constantinople was ex communicated

- The term Theotokos is biblical.
 Elizabeth said "I am so favoured, that the mother of my Lord come to me"
- Isaiah 9:6 prophesies about our Lord "He will be called Mighty God ". So St Mary is the Mother of God
- Simple, She is the mother of Jesus, and Jesus is God

- Always be watchful, for unity, and correct faith
- Especially at peace times!



- Eutyches, an abbot of a large monastery, was against Nestorius. He taught that the human nature of Jesus dissolved, what was left was his Divine nature
- He too was excommunicated, so he begged the emperor to remain in the church


Ephesus 2


- Pope Dioscorus chaired that council in 449
- Theodosius was the Orthodox Emperor, who was a great supporter of St Dioscorus
- The Bishop of Rome did not attend
- Eutyches submitted a statement with the correct faith, contrary to what he taught before
- So the council accepted him back in the church

FIRST FOUR ECUMENICAL COUNCILS (325, 380, 431, 450 C.E.)



- Flavian the bishop of Constantinople - then excommunicated Eutyches, he knew that he wasn't telling the truth
- So Ephesus 2,excommunicated Flavian
- He went to Bishop of Rome Leo, seeking protection





So Eutychus out, Flavian in, Leo's Tome adopted, but it was all about deposing St Dioscorus, the Pharaoh of Egypt



- So a lot of tension between the church leaders
- Pope Dioscorus was called the Pharaoh of Egypt as he was very powerful. Constantinople wanted to break his power and shift to where the emperor resided



- Emperor Theodosius who was a great support to Pope Dioscorus died
- Empress Pulcheria, married Marcian, an army leader, who became the emperor. She wanted to break the power of Pope Dioscorus

- She wanted Flavian the bishop of Contantinople to have the upper hand
- Chalcedon was convened
- Pope Dioscorus went with St Macarious (one of the 3 St Makariouses mentioned in every mass)

- Pope Dioscorus was outspoken, and very knowledgeable, very similar to St John Chrysostom
- Pope D asked why another council
- To clarify the faith
- but the faith of Athanasius and Cyril the Pillar of Faith remains unchanged

- Bishop Leo sent his Tome (letter/document) that the Lord had two natures that were united
- St D repeated the analogy taught by S t Cyril, the iron united with fire, now a new one nature, neither iron alone nor fire alone
- The hammering affected the human nature -the iron-, but the fire (The divine nature) did not suffer

- However, the divine never separated from the human nature
- Some bishops were persuaded with Pope D teachings, so the emperor declared: Pope D is on trial, he is a follower of Eutyches
- He was arrested, and it was decided to exile him, to a place north of Asia Minor

- Politics went on in a big way
- Who will out manoeuvre who
- Keep politics out of church

- Pulcheria reminded Pope D that he is about to have the same fate as St John Chrysostom, he replied by reminding her that the empress who treated St John C also suffered nasty illness, and never recovered from her illness

She smacked him hard on the cheek, broke 2 of his teeth, the soldiers pulled the hair of his beard, he sent the teeth and the hair of his beard to his children in Egypt, "these are the fruit of keeping the faith "

Chalcedon 451


- Led to the sad division of the church
- On the surface the division was about theological matters, but personalities and politics played a big role

- Chalcedon's outcome was concluded before it was convened
- P Dioscorus restricted the debate to the faith, but the empress and P Leo were talking politics
- Outcome of Chalcedon,
 Constantinople and Rome are
 Equal, Alexandria relegated, P D
 deposed



- Till 451, the whole Christian world was one, division started


A giant who departed early in the 5th Century- amazing mother, brilliant lawyer, best preacher in early church




Had to tell the empress off for wrong doings, spent 7 years in exile walking all days in the mountains, yet sermons full of peace
